SCRIPTURE READINGS

Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28 - Judgment against Jerusalem

- 4:11 At that time, it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert toward the daughter of my people, not to winnow or cleanse,
- 4:12 a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgment against them.
- 4:22 "For my people are foolish; they do not know me; they are stupid children; they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil, but do not know how to do good."
- 4:23 I looked on the earth, and it was complete chaos, and to the heavens, and they had no light.
- 4:24 I looked on the mountains, and they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro.
- 4:25 I looked, and there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled.
- 4:26 I looked, and the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the LORD, before his fierce anger.
- 4:27 For thus says the LORD: The whole land shall be a desolation, yet I will not make a full end.
- 4:28 Because of this the earth shall mourn and the heavens above grow black, for I have spoken; I have purposed; I have not relented, nor will I turn back.

<u>Psalm 14 - God in the company of the righteous (Psalter Lesson)</u> UMH 746 (Please read the bold text)

- 14:1 Fools say in their hearts, "There is no God." **They are corrupt; they do abominable deeds; there is no one who does good.**
- 14:2 The LORD looks down from heaven on all people, to see if there are any who are wise, who seek after God.
- 14:3 They have all gone astray; they are all alike perverse; there is no one who does good, no, not one.
- 14:4 Have they no knowledge, the evildoers who eat up my people as they eat bread and do not call upon the LORD?
- 14:5 There they shall be in great terror, for God is with the generation of the righteous.
- 14:6 You would confound the plans of the poor, but the LORD is their refuge.
- 14:7 O that deliverance for Israel would come from Zion! When the LORD restores their fortunes, Jacob will rejoice; and Israel shall be glad.

1 Timothy 1:12-17 - Christ Jesus came for sinners (Epistle Reading)

- 1:12 I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he considered me faithful and appointed me to his service,
- 1:13 even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief,
- 1:14 and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.
- 1:15 The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance; that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners--of whom I am the foremost.
- 1:16 But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, as an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life.
- 1:17 To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

Luke 15:1-10 - Lost sheep and lost (Gospel)

(Please stand as you are able)

- 15:1 Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him.
- 15:2 And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."
- 15:3 So, he told them this parable:
- 15:4 "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?
- 15:5 And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices.
- 15:6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my lost sheep.'
- 15:7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.
- 15:8 "Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it?
- 15:9 And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.'
- 15:10 Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Sanctuary Pew Frontals to be Removed

The Administrative Council unanimously approved the removal of the frontals or modesty rails from the front pews in order to provide better access to the chancel and altar. This also will allow the placement of an acoustic upright piano in the sanctuary which will provide a better instrument for worship. There are upgrades coming to the speaker system for the organ to enhance the congregational singing in praise to God and as a recital instrument.
