LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH

Reader 1: Today we light two candles- the first Candle is called HOPE and it is a reminder that God's promises are true.

Reader 2: The second Candle is called PEACE, God's gentle loving peace for our lives.

Reader1: We seek God's peace in this time of stress.

Reader 2: Come, all is ready. Let the light of this these candles, called HOPE and PEACE, bring brightness to your spirits.

(Light two blue candles of the Advent wreath.)

OPENING PRAYER (Please be seated)

Compassionate God, greet us with your grace this day, for we need you. We cannot save ourselves. Though we may be frantic with activity, our efforts do not yield peace; peace as you can give. Today we would be quiet enough to hear your voice. Today we would be still enough to feel your touch. Help us to find that place where we can receive as well as give, wait as well as act, and listen as well as speak. We need your peace. Let us come before you and learn your ways. Come to us now, through Jesus the Christ. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Baruch 5:1-9 - The return of scattered Israel

- 5:1 Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God.
- 5:2 Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting,
- 5:3 for God will show your splendor everywhere under heaven,
- 5:4 for God will give you evermore the name, "Righteous Peace, Godly Glory."
- 5:5 Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height; look toward the east, and see your children gathered from west and east at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them.
- 5:6 For they went out from you on foot, led away by their enemies, but God will bring them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne.
- 5:7 For God has ordered that every high mountain and the everlasting hills be made low and the valleys filled up, to make level ground, so that Israel may walk safely in the glory of God.
- 5:8 The woods and every fragrant tree have shaded Israel at God's command.
- 5:9 For God will lead Israel with joy, in the light of his glory, with the mercy and righteousness that come from him.

Luke 1:68-79 - God's tender compassion (Psalter Lesson)

(Please read the bold text)

- 1:68 "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.
- 1:69 He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his child David,
- 1:70 as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,
- **1:71** that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.
- 1:72 Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors and has remembered his holy covenant,

1:73 the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham, to grant us

- 1:74 that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear,
- **1:75** in holiness and righteousness in his presence all our days.
- 1:76 And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,
- **1:77** to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.
- 1:78 Because of the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us,
- **1:79** to shine upon those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Philippians 1:3-11 - A harvest of righteousness (Epistle Reading)

- 1:3 I thank my God for every remembrance of you,
- 1:4 always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy
- 1:5 for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.
- 1:6 I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ.
- 1:7 It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, for all of you are my partners in God's grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel.
- 1:8 For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the tender affection of Christ Jesus.
- 1:9 And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight
- 1:10 to help you to determine what really matters, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless,
- 1:11 having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Luke 3:1-6 - Prepare the way of the Lord (Gospel)

(Please stand as you are able)

- 3:1 In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene,
- 3:2 during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

- 3:3 He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins,
- 3:4 as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.
- 3:5 Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth,
- 3:6 and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

L: This is the word of the Lord for the people of Christ. **P: Thanks be to God.**

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (Please be seated)

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor. (Let us offer our silent confessions.)

Lord, hear us this day as we open our hearts and our spirits to you. These times in which we live are often confusing and fearful. We are pushed to make preparations for a season which is supposed to bring hope and peace; yet we crowd it with obligations and stresses and shut the door to your healing love and compassion. We find ourselves being on edge, fretful, wondering if we have done enough, can do enough. You answer our fears with your voice, "Peace, be still". Help us to hear you. Slow us down. Encourage us to take some time to listen rather than shout, to stop and rest rather than run. Cause us to look around at situations and people who are in need and to place our focus on helping them. For it is in helping your people and reaching out in love that we will find true peace. These things we pray, in Jesus' Name. AMEN.

WORDS OF ASSURANCE

Jesus said, "I am bring you peace, not the kind of peace the world would give to you. My peace I give to you, now and forever." Be at peace. Know God's love is given for you. AMEN.
