Dear Lake Toxaway United Methodist Church Family,

I think that it has become clear that we will continue to worship by internet virtual connection through mid-May and possibly longer as the governor of North Carolina has outlined a way forward in opening our state in his plans announced Thursday, April 23. I expect we will receive guidance from Bishop Leeland next week. The leadership team at Lake Toxaway wants to stay in compliance while continuing to explore creative ways to live in community!

As I have studied the lectionary texts for worship this week, I have been struck with the gospel of Luke's telling of Jesus's appearance to two disciples on the road to Emmaus and how frequently our vision is clouded by news and personal tragedy in ways that prevent us from recognizing His presence among us. I have reflected and prayed this week about the places and ways that Jesus appears in the midst of this COVID-19 pandemic. I invite you to consider this question and reflect how our Resurrection Vision can see Christ at work in this unprecedented time.

I have several places where I have seen the risen Lord in our midst. For one, I have embraced the idea that online church is here to stay with us! The Holy Spirit has invited me to see this as a positive because our summer membership can stay connected when you are away. We will strive to continue to get the worship bulletin and service out so that you may be involved as much as you want when you are away. I also think this virtual reality allows us to invite people into our community by an easier way; we can invite friends and neighbors to participate in a virtual service and allow them to be more comfortable on a first visit to worship with us. We can invite our members that must stay at home because of illness or longer confinement at home.

I see Christ among us in the ways that people are reaching out to each other in support! This congregation has remained firm in its commitment to provide bold financial support to our community partners. This week, the Outreach Committee has reviewed applications for our scholarship program that supports Rosman High School seniors in their pursuit of higher educational goals. Several of you have volunteered to make masks and provided them to others. I learned that some of you took food items to the Lake Toxaway Community Center and those items were taken to Seneca, South Carolina where the storms on Easter night hit hardest. You are reaching out to each other and offering to pick up things for your neighbors when you are required to make necessary trips to the grocery store. Residents of Lake Toxaway and Sapphire have purchased extra "take-out meals" from area restaurants that have been distributed in a variety of places in this community.

I pray for all of you and ask you to continue to pray for your church family as we move forward in this uncharted territory. Reach out to me with your joys and needs. I hold you close in my heart!

1:18 You know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold,

1:19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without defect or blemish. 1:20 He was destined before the foundation of the world, but was revealed at the end of the ages for your sake.

1:21 Through him you have come to trust in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are set on God.

Luke 24:13-35

24:13 Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem,

24:14 and talking with each other about all these things that had happened.

24:15 While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, 24:16 but their eyes were kept from recognizing him.

24:17 And he said to them, "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" They stood still, looking sad.

24:18 Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?"

24:19 He asked them, "What things?" They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people,

24:20 and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him.

24:21 But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place.

24:22 Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning,

24:23 and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive.

24:24 Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him."

24:25 Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared!

24:26 Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?"

24:27 Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about

himself in all the scriptures.

24:28 As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on.

24:29 But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them.

24:30 When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them.

24:31 Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight.

24:32 They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"

24:33 That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together.

24:34 They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" 24:35 Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.
