## **Dear Lake Toxaway United Methodist Church Family,**

Some weeks inspiration remains elusive; we have hopes to accomplish items on the "To-Do" list. As we survey the previous week, we question ourselves and others about the lack of finished tasks. We rush to blame our lack of energy on the rainy and gray days we are experiencing here in Western North Carolina. We point to the continuing details of the nightmare of COVID-19 and how it has created so many "closed" signs on businesses, schools, libraries, theaters. Some might even say the Church is closed.

This week, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. The Greek work is the name for an Israelite Feast of Weeks and is the second of Israel's classical pilgrim feasts: Passover, Weeks and Booths. Pentecost originated as an agricultural feast that celebrated the end of the grain harvest and then moved to a celebration of the giving of the law at Sinai. For Christians, Pentecost became the celebration of the "birthday of the Church." Pentecost points us back to a story in Genesis 11 where a group of people were scattered all over the Earth and spoke in languages that none of them could understand (The Tower of Babel). Today, in the story from Acts, we read about a group of diverse Galileans gathered in one place; they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. While their languages previously were numerous, they began to hear in their native languages because of the infusion of the Spirit's work in unifying the diverse group of Jews and Jewish converts into a gifted One Body commissioned to spread the Good News of living water given freely by Christ Jesus.

In light of Pentecost and the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit, we are invited to remember The Church has faced difficult times throughout history. We might think our inspiration is self-generated or even worse, pastor generated. Inspiration and power come from the Holy Spirit. The Good News of God's work in the Holy Spirit invites us to open ourselves to the power of the Holy Spirit at work in us and to remember the Church is not a historic building. The Church may have left the building for an indeterminate time (remember our cycle was to gather in the building every Sunday and to disperse into the community), but The Church continues as people redeemed by Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit to gather by another means (virtually) and to continue to participate in the ministry of becoming one body in this glorious and divine work of God.

I have appreciated praying the Psalm for this week. I find the invitation to celebrate the power of the Spirit as a call to embrace or to open myself fully to the power and gift of the Spirit. If we continue to remain open to the Spirit's leadership, I know as a Christ-followers, we invite others to experience the renewal and creativity that the Holy Spirit brings to the Church in this time where healing, peace, love, mercy, forgiveness, grace are needed. We are invited to let go of our need for control and experience God's leadership in the Holy Spirit. Join me and your sisters and brothers as we "sing praise to our God while we have our being. May our meditation be pleasing to him, for we rejoice in the LORD!"

I believe the Holy Spirit continues to work in and through those of us who present ourselves as open and willing. I want to close by sharing words from the Apostle Paul from Ephesians 4:30-32 that remind us about our Christian responsibility and influence. "And do not sadden the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

#### Acts 2:1-21

- 2:2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.
- 2:3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.
- 2:4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.
- 2:5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem.
- 2:6 And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.
- 2:7 Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?
- 2:8 And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?
- 2:9 Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,
- 2:10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes,
- 2:11 Cretans and Arabs--in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."
- 2:12 All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"
- 2:13 But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."
- 2:14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.
- 2:15 Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning.
- 2:16 No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:
- 2:17 In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.
- 2:18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.
- 2:19 And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
- 2:20 The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.
- 2:21 Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

- 12:9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit,

- 12:11 All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.
- 12:12 For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.
- in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body--Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

#### John 7:37-39

- 7:37 On the last day of the festival, the great day, while Jesus was standing there, he cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me,
- 7:38 and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"
- 7:39 Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

P: Thanks be to God!
