Dear Lake Toxaway United Methodist Church Family,

I clip prayers, stories, poems and other items all the time. I plan and think I will scan these clippings into a folder on my computer and discard the paper, but I have a favorite Bible where many of these clippings get placed. I'm sure some of you can relate to this habit.

This week, I ran across the following prayer I used in a bulletin many years ago. The prayer was used as an offertory thanksgiving prayer. One of you also clipped this prayer and related to me it was one of your favorite prayers (I noted the individual on the back of the copy). I believe the Holy Spirit places things in our hands and hearts when needed.

This prayer seems so appropriate for this time, so I share it with you:

Living God, we give thanks for the many blessings you bestow in and on our lives in the midst of turbulent times. The greatest of these is that the risen Christ dwells in our hearts — in the innermost recesses of our lives through the power of your Spirit. His love binds us and others to you and names us as members of Your family. His love enriches and enhances our lives in ways that knowledge never could; His love enables us to accomplish far more than we could ever dream or imagine. We worship and praise You, O God, for so blessing our lives and we pray that all we do and say will bring glory to You and Christ whom we serve and in whose name we pray. Amen.

This Sunday we celebrate a doctrine that remains a mystery to me: The Trinity. We know God as one God in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I remember seminary classes and debates around this historic doctrine of the church. One of my professors stressed we not fall into modalism, meaning we treat each distinct person of the Godhead as separate. I remember fondly how the professor spoke with passion against using the illustration of water, ice, and mist/vapor as an example to understand this doctrine. He emphatically stated God is always the three persons in one and human illustrations failed to explain this mystery of our faith.

I, like many of you, learned to accept this doctrine by faith and not seek an argument that explained it. Faith requires a leap into something I cannot fully understand, see, or hear. When I leap, I always find God's hands ready to embrace me and love me.

May we seek to leap into the arms of our Triune God and seek His guidance and wisdom in dreaming and imagining what God wants to do in this time. What better witness can we offer to a world facing a pandemic and division? I encourage all of us to leap into the arms of the Triune God with trust God will bring healing.

I continue to seek to serve our Lord with a humble and willing heart,

- 1:12 The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good.
- 1:13 And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.
- 1:14 And God said, "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years,
- 1:15 and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth." And it was so.
- 1:16 God made the two great lights--the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night--and the stars.
- 1:17 God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth,
- 1:18 to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good.
- 1:19 And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.
- 1:20 And God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky."
- 1:21 So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good.
- 1:22 God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth."
- 1:23 And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

- 1:24 And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind." And it was so.
- 1:25 God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.
- 1:26 Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."
- 1:27 So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.
- 1:28 God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."
- 1:29 God said, "See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food.
- 1:30 And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so.

Announcements


