Dear Lake Toxaway UMC Family and Community,

The story of the miraculous feeding of 5000 has always fascinated me. I remember Sunday School classes where this miracle was the lesson; this miracle is found in all four gospels. The account from John's gospel has a detail I remember every time this miracle comes into our lectionary readings. In John's account there was a young boy who had brought the five loaves and two pieces of fish.

I can remember teachers inviting me and the others to imagine who this young boy might have been, and I always left Sunday School with a strong belief about myself or one of my friends and our ability to have been that young boy. I remember how my teachers stressed a willing heart as important in the work of Christ.

This week, I have found myself drawn away from my childhood focus. The verse God has invited me to hear (Matthew 14:14) involves not the how but the why of the miracle. The motivation for this miracle and the healing events was the compassion of Jesus.

Jesus wanted to spend some time alone because he had heard the tragic news of John the Baptist's death. He needed some time to process his initial grief and shock, yet he recognized the needs of those around him and wanted to meet those needs.

Next week in worship and in an upcoming newsletter, our church family will have the opportunity to celebrate the serving ministries of the church. We will hear how we meet needs of people outside of this particular church. I invite us to move away from tracking how much we give (this is important) as we hear some of these stories of our church's outreach and remember God can take a little (5 loaves and 2 pieces of fish) and make a huge difference in the lives of those around us.

I find this as an opportunity to celebrate the abundance of God's grace as opposed to last week's invitation to celebrate the sufficiency of God's grace. All of us have a story/testimony about the abundance of God's grace in our lives and in the lives of those for whom we care. As we hear these stories, may we remember how lives are transformed because hunger and brokenness were healed.

Remember the Church is not closed in this time of a pandemic; the Church is deployed! Even though we are separated in our worship and not meeting face to face, we are still the Church. We recognize we are blessed to be a blessing!

I continue in my desire to see you. I miss you. I seek to serve you in your pastoral needs. I pray regularly for many of you as you face loss, challenges with aging parents or children and grandchildren, serious illnesses, and day to day challenges in isolation. Please call, email, or text me with your needs. I seek to be found faithful to God in serving as your pastor.
