# LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH

**Reader One:** It's a reunion, every time we go home, every time we embrace those we love, no matter how long it has been. It feels like sunrise, like the clouds are parting and the rain has ended. It is joy, nothing less than pure joy to grab hold of those who are home for us, who make home for us. Whether we wake up to them every day, or travel many miles to see them again, it is joy to go home.

**Reader Two:** The prophet Zephaniah tells us to rejoice at the thought of going home. The prophet tells us to imagine being set free, being unburdened, being released to live, to fully live in the grace and wonder of life itself, surrounded by those who love us like no one else. And then to live like that was our truth even now, even here. It is joy to go home.

**Reader One:** John the Baptist reminds us, however, that it takes choices to live in this joy. It doesn't just happen; we choose to make life a joy by how we love others, by how we serve and give and care for others, by how we do the job we do and how we impact the world around us. We build joy as we build a home in this world and the next.

(Light the three candles on the Advent wreath. Today's candle is a distinct color, pink for Joy.)

#### **OPENING PRAYER** (Please be seated)

Eternal Creator, with you each moment of life is full of wonder and surprise. We pray you to make us watchful as we await the coming of Christ. Grant that we may not be found sleeping in sin, but awake and rejoicing in your newness of life. Through the same Jesus Christ our Savior, Amen.

### SCRIPTURE READINGS

### Zephaniah 3:14-20 - Rejoice in God

- 3:14 Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!
- 3:15 The LORD has taken away the judgments against you; he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.
- 3:16 On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: "Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak.
- 3:17 The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing
- 3:18 as on a day of festival." I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it.
- 3:19 I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth.
- 3:20 At that time, I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the LORD.

### Isaiah 12:2-6 - In your midst is the Holy One of Israel (Psalter Lesson)

#### (Please read the bold text)

- 12:2 Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and will not be afraid, for the LORD is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation."
- 12:3 With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.
- 12:4 And you will say on that day: "Give thanks to the LORD; call on his name; make known his deeds among the nations; proclaim that his name is exalted.
- 12:5 Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth.
- 12:6 Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."

# Philippians 4:4-7 - Rejoice, the Lord is near (Epistle Reading)

- 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice.
- 4:5 Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near.
- 4:6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.
- 4:7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

## Luke 3:7-18 - One more powerful is coming (Gospel)

#### (Please stand as you are able)

- 3:7 John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?
- 3:8 Therefore, bear fruits worthy of repentance, and do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.
- 3:9 Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore, every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."
- 3:10 And the crowds asked him, "What, then, should we do?"
- 3:11 In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none, and whoever has food must do likewise."
- 3:12 Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?"
- 3:13 He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you."
- 3:14 Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."
- 3:15 As the people were filled with expectation and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah,
- 3:16 John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water, but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.
- 3:17 His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
- 3:18 So, with many other exhortations he proclaimed the good news to the people.

L: This is the word of the Lord for the people of Christ.

## P: Thanks be to God.

#### PRAYER OF CONFESSION (Please be seated)

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor. (Let us offer our silent confessions.)

Creator of the universe, we stand amazed at your power and glory. We are eager to worship you and offer our praise, but we are often reluctant to answer when we hear you calling our name.

We sing our songs of tribute in the sanctuary, but shy away from the river, lest we be baptized with the fire of the Holy Spirit.

Forgive us when we forget your promise to be with us always, O God. Renew us with the power of your ever-present love, and strengthen us to proclaim your justice throughout the world. Amen.

## WORDS OF ASSURANCE

The messenger has been sent to you, proclaiming that there is One who is Coming who will heal and lead you. Know that this is a great gift from God, who has always and will always love you.

In the name of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven. Thanks be to God! Amen!

## HOMILY

**STATEMENT OF FAITH** #880 (*The Nicene Creed – Please stand as you are able*)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit, he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.
