In 2020, our church will provide the weekend meals at **The Haven** for the following dates: April 17, May 29, August 14 and October 2. The meals included are Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast. The twelve to twenty-two residents are so grateful when a homemade or store-bought meal is delivered. Last year, one passionate woman greeted the delivery of hot meatloaf, with fork in hand, sharing, "I thought about this all night long. Bless you and thank you so much." Volunteers from our congregation that have provided a weekend of meals have said, "this small effort to provide meals meant so much more to me than those residents will ever know."

Message from Marcus

ADVENT, CHRISTMAS and EPHINAY SEASONS

The Season of Advent invites us to reflect on the prophetic voices of the Hebrew Scriptures that promise hope, joy, peace and love that will enter the Cosmos and usher in a New Son of David in the Royal City of Jerusalem. Christmas invites us to ponder with the Virgin Mary that incredible Incarnation of God as fully human in the Bethlehem Babe, Jesus. Epiphany invites us to look for the new manifestations of God among us and to shine Light into the dark spaces.

We, as a church and individuals, have various ways of preparing during Advent, celebrating Christmas, and receiving Epiphany insights. Last night at Lake Toxaway United Methodist Church, the smaller Winter fellowship gathered for a simple covered dish meal in the parish hall and then convened to the sanctuary to decorate for Advent and Christmas. We placed cross stitch ornaments on the Crimson tree. These ornaments were made by the Lake Toxaway stitchery group over 25 years ago. We placed wreaths in the windows. Finally, Ruth Cech, our organist, directed us in signing some familiar Advent and Christmas hymns. She read two hymn stories and concluded with a devotional. She also directed us in forming a choir to sing "Go Tell It on the Mountain." We reveled in the powerful grace of the moment. If you have never experienced this wonderful evening, plan to be with us on the first Wednesday in December. Christ was present in so many tangible ways! I can only imagine how better it would be if all of our church family could be present.

We serve a wonderful Lord who loved us so much that He willingly gave up his exalted place with His Father to come and live as fully God and fully human to provide salvation for us. As I considered what to write, I enjoyed thinking of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany because the full picture of who God came to love is present in the combined story: shepherds regarded as among the lowest of the social order and Persian Astronomers of great wealth. And I cannot fail to mention Mary and Joseph. All were called and invited to be used as God's vessels to bring Jesus to us and to receive God's gift of the Incarnation and to gather in worship of God's great gift.

I encourage you to look for ways in which Christ continues to appear among us. The Incarnation continues in us because Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit dwells within us who receive his forgiveness, mercy, and grace. This congregation at Lake Toxaway has been empowered to be a part of the body of Christ in our community that extends to the many places where our parishioners go and to the places where we participate in ministries of outreach. I hope that we as a church continue to capture the vision of finding ourselves in a position to give fifty percent of our offerings to outreach causes locally and worldwide.

Finally, receive my greeting of love and appreciation. I continue to find great joy in serving alongside you as your pastor or one of your pastors. As the psalmist said in Psalm 16, "The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places." I sing that line daily. I encourage all of us to participate faithfully in worship, prayer, Bible reading, tithing, and the other disciplines of our faith. God bless all of you who read this message and know how important you are to this pastor and more significantly, to God.
